For the uninitiated, Nara is a compact city packed with rich heritage and beautiful Japanese architecture located just 30 minutes away from Osaka.

Nara Transport pass options:

There are many different passes for you to travel to and around Nara, here are some of your options:

Kintetsu Rail Pass



We personally prefer the <u>Kintetsu</u> line because the Kintetsu Nara station is more centrally located than the JR Nara station and has better access to the main attractions.

Getting to Nara from Osaka by Kintetsu Rail

Hop aboard the <u>Kintetsu</u> Nara Line from Osaka Namba station and arrive at the Kintetsu Nara station.

Kansai JR Pass

You're going to need a <u>Kansai</u> Japan Rail Pass for your travels on the JR Lines for the activities on this itinerary. If you are planning to travel to other Japanese cities like Tokyo, we'd suggesting getting the <u>7 Day</u> Japan Rail Pass instead that covers the whole of Japan!



Getting to Kyoto

With JR Pass

Option 1: Shinkansen from Shin-Osaka to Kyoto station. Use your JR Pass on this high speed shinkansen that will take you to kyoto in just 15 minutes!

Located just a 15 minute train ride away, Kyoto is home to Japan's most beautiful temples, shrines and even nature parks.

Option 2: JR Kyoto Line from Osaka station to Kyoto station.

Hop onto the special rapid train with your JR pass that will take you from Osaka station to Kyoto station in 29 minutes!

Without JR Pass

Option 1: Keihan Main Line from Yodoyabashi station to Sanjo station. This ride will take you 55 minutes and cost JPY 410.

Getting there:

Meet tour guide at Kyoto Station



Built by famous movie star Denjiro, this **Okochi mountain villa** is a spectacular sight not to be missed. The lovely gardens provide a sweeping view of the city and every corner provides a good photo opportunity!

The famed **Arashiyama bamboo forest** is definitely a must visit in Kyoto. Stroll along the bamboo lined avenues and take in the lush green views. Standing amidst these soaring stalks of bamboo will definitely leave you feeling as if you've stepped into another world.





It is said that the **Nonomiya Shrine** is home to a power stone called "Okame-ishi" and if you rub the stone, your wishes might just come true! For those looking for some help in the romance department, the matchmaking tablet in the shrine is said to be especially popular.

The shrine is also home to deities like the God of Conception, Smooth Childbirth, Prosperous Businesses, Health and Wisdom.

1230-1330: Lunch at Nishiki Market



3 1330 - 1430: Nijio Castle

After eating through the alleys of the Nishiki market, it's time for more exploration! This 5 storey castle was initially used an the imperial palace before it opened up to the public. This UNESCO world heritage site gracefully showcases one of the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture.

Getting there:

From Kyotoshiyakusho-Mae station, hop onto the Tozai line and alight 2 stops later at Nijojo-Mae station. The castle is a 7 minute walk away.





1430 - 1600: Gion

Take the Tozai line from Nijojo-Mae station (3 stops) to Sanjo station and Gion is a short walk away!

Also known as the Gion Shrine, the is one the most famous shrines in Kyoto. We suggest coming at evening for the lantern light up - every lantern bears the name of a local business in return for a donation.

Getting there:

Yasaka shrine is just a short walk away from Gion.


1700 - 1900: Izuju Sushi

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0900-1230: Fushimi Inari and Sake Brewery Tour

Wander into the depths of sake cellars and taste the unique flavors of the Japanese favorite rice wine beverage! Learn the secrets behind the different brewing techniques that turn the Fushimi Hill spring water into sake. We'd recommend getting the free sampling add on if you're a fan of sake!

The iconic orange torii gates of the Fushimi Inari Shrine are almost a must when in Kyoto. Explore the depths of the forest and arrive at these striking scarlet gates for your Instagram moment. The sake brewery tour ends here and you will be dropped off at Kyoto Station.

(Heian Jingu Shrine, Sanjusangen-do Temple, Kiyomizu-dera Temple)

Klook your <u>Kyoto afternoon exploration tour</u> and visit all 3 places mentioned above! Meet your local guide at Kyoto station and have him show you the local's point of view of these places as well as tell you the stories behind them. Afterall, if you're visiting these shrines on your own, you'll be missing out on the great history of Japan!

Getting there:

Meet the guide at Kyoto Avanti (Kyoto Station Hachijo Exit)



With a distinctive chinese influence all around, the **Heian Jingu shrine** is one of the younger shrines in Kyoto. The iconic giant torii gates will probably be the first thing you notice as many stand under these gates for their pictures.



The **Sanjusangen-do temple** is Japan's longest wooden structure. Iconically known for its 1001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of mercy, step into the main hall and get blown away but the sheer magnitude of Kannons. The attention to the intricacy of these gold statues will have you staring at each one in great detail.



The **Kiyomizu-dera temple**, also known as the clear water temple is one of the most celebrated temples in Japan. Apart from the stunning views you'll get from the wooden stage, come at spring or fall for a sea of cherry blossoms or maple leaves.

At the base of the Kiyomizu-dera's main hall lie 3 streams. The Japanese believe that drinking from these springs will bring longevity, success at school and a blossoming love life respectively. However, be warned that drinking from all 3 streams is considered greedy.

Klook your ninja dinner and show at Labyrinth for a great night with the gang on your last night in Kyoto!



You'll only be needing I transport pass to cover the whole of Rokkosan and that's the Rokkosan Tourist Pass. It includes the following:


- Kobe City Bus No 16 Round Trip

Hankyu Line: If you've got the Hankyu pass, take the Hankyu line from Hankyu Umeda to Hankyu Rokko.

1045-1345: Tenran Observatory and Cafe

First thing you need to do when you get up Mount Rokko is definitely to take in the majestic views! Located at the upper end of the Rokko cable car, get ready for the million dollar view that overlooks Kobe, Osaka and the bay. Be sure to pack a light jacket because it can be pretty chilly so high up! Stop by the Tenran Cafe for some pasta and be sure to get a seat at the terrace area to eat and take in the views.

Getting there:

Take the Kobe city bus to the Rokko cable shita station and the cable car to the top!



1345-1545: Rokko Alpine Botanical Garden

Home to approximately 1500 kinds of alpine plants, these flora grow at 865 metres above sea level! Take a stroll in the botanical gardens and stop to smell the flowers. Visits in the different seasons will also show the different varieties of the flowers.

Getting there:

Take the Rokko Sanjo bus and alight at Rokko Alpine Botanical Garden
