Visit the studio sets of Platform 9 3/4, the Gryffindor common room, the Weasley's kitchen from The Burrow and more!

Follow in the footsteps of Harry, Ron and Hermione deep into the grounds of the Forbidden Forest, with an incredible 19 trees, each with a diameter of over 12 feet.

You'll also be able to control the weather using the same techniques created by filmmakers!

0900-1100: Breakfast, then stroll around Covent Garden

1120: Begin the London London Hop On Hop Off Tour

You're free to drop by at any of their 65 stops across the city and embark on a journey in the streets of London

Arrive at your destinations quickly via 3 feeder services that connect to the major train stations and hotel districts

For a first-timer in London, we recommend going with the <u>Yellow</u> <u>Route</u>. The start of the route is at Victoria and you can hop on or hop off anywhere along the route.

Begin your hop on hop off journey today at Covent Garden stop and and pass through London's top attractions. Learn more each sights as you follow along the multi-lingual commentaries. You can also refer to the <u>bus map</u> and <u>bus</u> <u>timetable</u> for bus stops.









1120-1250: St Paul's Cathedral

Hop off at the <u>St. Paul's Cathedral</u> stop. Situated on Ludgate Hill at the highest point of the city, the church has a splendid panoramic view overlooking London.

This popular landmark doesn't serve just as an attraction by also as a center for various national events like royal weddings, state funerals and more.



1210-1400: The Shard

Standing at 310 metres high in the heart of London, it's hard to miss the distinguishable elongated glass pyramid of The Shard.

With arguably the best view of the city, make sure you Klook your ticket to <u>'The View' at The</u> <u>Shard</u>, London's highest viewing platform.

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1510-1600: Tower Bridge & Tower of London

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1620-1800: London Eye

1000-1330: Discover the weird & wonderful in Camden Town

A famous town known for its vibrant market as well as counter culture, simply walk down the high street of Camden to witness a cauldron of eclectic fashion stores, punk moments, unique cafes and more.

Being conventional is certainly not in the dictionary of Camden and the vibe in this city is unlike any other. Walk through the Camden Market and let your senses be stimulated by the myriad of sights, sounds and smells.

Get lost in the labyrinth of arched warrens, niche stalls and vintage shops in the indoor market. Quaint and whimsical, it's hard not to be charmed by this wonderful maze.

When you're hungry from all the walking and exploring, you can grab a bite at one of the many food vendors, restaurants and cafes around Camden Town.

It's also a great place to look for artisanal food that you can't find elsewhere!

Getting there: Camden Town can be accessed through the Camden Town Underground Station





There are also a number for restaurants and cafes to dine at or to get a meal to-go.

Before getting on your train to Paris, it's good to get a packed lunch to bring onboard in case you get hungry during your train journey.

Depending on your train package, you might get served light meals onboard. Otherwise you may purchase your own food from the train's bar buffet.



1350-1430: Look for Platform 9 ³/₄ in London King's Cross

Make your way to London King's Cross, which is located right next to the St Pancras International railway station.

At King's Cross is where you'll find the famous Platform 9 ¾ but don't go charging towards! Although we wish Hogwarts was real, perhaps the closest you can get is the Harry Potter Shop at Platform 9 ¾ right beside the half-trolley.

1430 - 1800: Eurostar from London to Paris

The London-Paris Eurostar train departs from London's St Pancras International railway station.

The brisk 2 hours and 16 minutes train ride is included in the <u>Eurail Global Pass</u>, which is especially useful if you're travelling to to other places within Europe.

Check-in for Eurostar train

It's good to arrive at least an hour before your train departs. Passengers need to be checked in at least 30 to 45 minutes before departure. Passport checks are done during the check-in before leaving the UK, so you can you can step straight off the train when you arrive in Paris.

The London-Paris Eurostar trains arrives right in the heart of Paris at Gare du Nord station, which allows for easy access to different parts of the city.

This pass gives you access to 4 bus routes - Blue, Green, Red, and Yellow - which means you can visit all the must-see location in the most romantic city in the world.

For today's itinerary, the best route to take would be the Blue route followed by the Green route. As you ride the open top bus, you can also listen to the audio guides available in 10 languages and learn everything about the city!

Easily the most famous avenue in the world, the Avenue des Champs-Élysées is every shopaholic's dream! From your luxury brands to chain stores, stylish cafes, and more, Champs-Élysées is a must-visit in Paris.

The perfect place for breakfast is, of course, at Ladurée. A French luxury bakery and sweets maker house knowns for their macarons, they also have a dizzying array of patisserie. You can get your pastry to-go or dine in at the restaurant attached to the bakery!

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1130-1200: Arc de Triomphe

Public transport to Disneyland Paris

The closest train station to Disneyland Paris is the Marne-la-Vallée - Chessy train station, which is about a 2-minute walk to the Disney Parks. The Marne-la-Vallée - Chessy station is an important hub and can be easily accessed by several railway networks.

From downtown Paris, take the Metro to Chatelet-Les Halles or Nation then interchange to the RER A Line and stop at the Marne-la-Vallée - Chessy station. The journey will take approximately an hour.

Transport to and from Disneyland Paris

Disneyland Paris, originally Euro Disney Resort, is actually located 32 km east of the centre of Paris. About 40-min drive by car, the most convenient and hassle-free way to get there from downtown Paris is by a private transfer.
